CODE OF ETHICS IN RESEARCH PUBLICATION

- a. Researchers do not fabricate data. (They do not make false, deceptive, or fraudulent statements concerning their publications or research findings.)
- b. If they discover significant errors in their published data, they take reasonable steps to correct such errors in a correction, re-traction, erratum, or other appropriate publication means.
- c. They do not present portions of another's work or data as their own, even if the other work or data source is cited occasionally.
- d. It is important to distinguish between error and fraud.
- e. Fraud is an explicit effort to falsify or misrepresent data.
- f. One of the most common types of publication misconduct is plagiarism–
- g. When one author deliberately uses another's work without permission, credit, or acknowledgment. Plagiarism takes different forms, from literal copying to paraphrasing some else's work and can include Rreproducing a work word for word, in whole or in part, without permission and acknowledgment of the original source.
- h. Yes. Literal copying is only acceptable if you reference the source and put quotation marks around the copied text.
- i. Keep track of sources you used while researching and where you used it in your paper.
- j. Make sure you fully acknowledge and properly cite the original source in your paper.
- k. Use quotation marks around word-for-word text and reference properly.
- l. Literal Copying MEANS this can include research materials, processes, tables, or equipment.
- m. "Substantial" can be defined as both quantity and quality of what was copied.
- n. If your work captures the essence of another's work, it should be cited.
- o. Ask yourself if your work has benefited from the skill and judgment of the original author?
- p. If so, be sure to cite the original source.
- q. Paraphrasing is only acceptable if you properly reference the source and make sure that you do not change the meaning intended by the source.
- r. Never copy and paste words that you do not fully understand.
- s. Make sure to reference the source accordingly.
